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VALLEY IMPROVEMENTS

The big development, of course, 1s the new 3-seater Chair Lift which commences in a newly levelled area beside the Valley Inn (our side) with a Middle Station below Cooma Hut and a Top Station just below the top of the Olympic T-bar. 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VEHICLE CHAINS IN KOSCIUSKO NATIONAL PARK. New legal requirements.

Between the 1st June and the 10th October each year, all vehicles travelling in snow/ice risk sections of the Park, must carry chains suitable for their vehicle. Those snow/ice risk sections will normally commence at Sawpit Camp ground and applies to all roads above that point. It also applies to the park entrance at Little Thredbo River if you are travelling to Thredbo. N.P.W.L.S. staff, Main Road staff and Police are all authorised to enforce the conditions of entry. If you get barrelled, the maximum fine is \$200. (Chains must be cheaper than that!)


